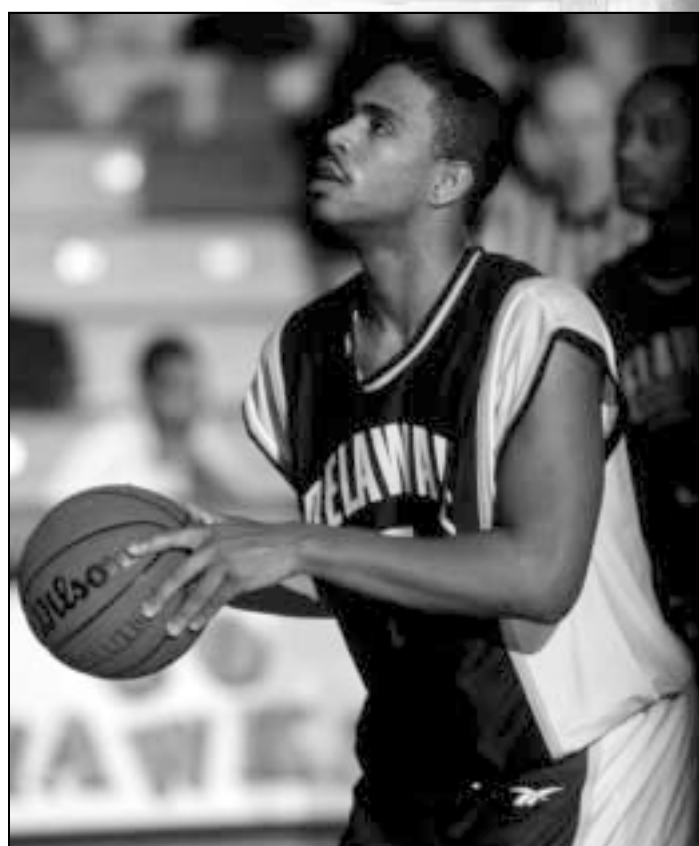

**From the North:** Take Interstate 87 (Northway) south to Exit 1E. Off the exit, proceed to Interstate 90 east (Albany/Boston). Take Exit 2 (Washington Avenue) which leads right into University at Albany Follow University Drive (heading south) one mile to Recreation & Convocation Center (RACC). As you approach the RACC, parking is to the right or on the south side of the arena.

**From the South:** Take Interstate 87 (Thruway) north to Exit 24. After the tollbooths, proceed onto Interstate 90 east towards Boston. Take Exit 2 (Washington Avenue) which leads right into the University at Albany. Follow directions above.

**From the East:** Take Interstate 90 west towards Buffalo. Leave interstate at Exit 2 (Fuller Road). Turn left at Fuller Road and then take next left at Washington Avenue. The University at Albany. Follow directions above.

**From the West:** Take Interstate 90 (Thruway) east to Exit 24. Follow "From the South" directions above.

**From Albany International Airport:** Exit the airport onto Albany-Shaker Road; Follow signs to I-87; Turn right onto I-87 South; I-87 to Exit 1; I-90 East to Exit 2; cross Washington Avenue onto campus. Follow directions above.

### BINGHAMTON UNIVERSITY

**By Air:** Binghamton Regional Airport

**Distance from Airport to Events Center:** 10 miles

**From Southern New England and Down State New York:** I-87 (Thruway) to Exit 16 to Route 17 West. Continue on Route 17 West to Exit 70 South (Route 201). Follow 201 and the SUNY signs to the traffic circle. Take first right off circle, crossing bridge to Route 434 East. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

**From Northern New England and the Albany-Oneonta, New York Area:** I-88 West to I-81 South to Route 17 West. Continue 17 West to Exit 70 South (Route 201). Follow 201 and the SUNY signs to the traffic circle. Take first right off circle, crossing bridge to Route 434 East. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

**From the West:** Follow Route 17 East to Exit 70 South (Route 201). Follow 201 and the SUNY signs to the traffic circle. Take first right off circle, crossing bridge to Route 434 East. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

**From Binghamton Regional Airport:** Exit the main drive onto Airport Road. Go eight miles SOUTH to Rte. 17 West. Travel west on 17 to Exit 70 SOUTH (Route 201). Follow Route 201 and the SUNY signs to the traffic circle. Take first right off circle, crossing bridge to Route 434 EAST. The main entrance to campus is your first right.

### BOSTON UNIVERSITY

**By Air:** Boston's Logan International Airport

**Distance from Airport to Case Gymnasium and Agganis Arena:** less than 10 miles

**By Train:** Amtrak service is available to Boston's South Station.

**Public Transit:** The MBTA Green Line's "B" trains stop at Babcock Street (Case Gym) and St. Paul Street (Agganis Arena).

**From West:** Massachusetts Turnpike Eastbound (Route 90) or Route 128, take the Mass Pike extension to Exit 18-marked Cambridge-Allston. After the toll, bear right at the sign marked Cambridge. Turn right at the Double Tree Hotel onto Storrow Drive. Take your first exit off Storrow Drive (It's the Boston University exit) and proceed to stop sign. Turn right onto Commonwealth Avenue.

For Case Gym – Continue on Commonwealth Avenue, past McDonald's, to the sixth traffic light. Turn right onto Babcock Street. The Case Center is located on your right.

For Agganis Arena – Continue on Commonwealth Avenue, immediately after the arena turn right onto Harry Agganis Way.

**From East:** Turnpike Westbound to Exit 20, Cambridge-Allston, stay right and follow the instructions as above.

**From Logan Airport:** Take Ted Williams Tunnel to I-90 West. Follow directions for Westbound (above).

### UNIVERSITY OF HARTFORD

**By Air:** Hartford's Bradley International Airport

**Distance from Bradley Airport to Chase Family Arena:** 10 miles

**From Points East:** Take Mass Pike (West). Follow Mass Pike to Interstate 84. Follow I-84 West, take exit 61 onto I-291 West. Follow to exit 1 (Route 218). At the end of the ramp, turn left onto Wolcott Avenue. Continue straight as Wolcott Avenue turns into Cottage Grove Road (Route 218). After traveling four miles from the exit you will come to the intersection of routes 218 and 189. Take a left onto Bloomfield Avenue (Route 189 South) and proceed to the University of Hartford entrance less than two miles on the left. Upon entering campus, follow signs to the Sports Center.

**From Points West:** Follow Interstate 84 East to Exit 44 (Prospect Avenue). Bear to the left at the stop sign, then take a left at the light onto Prospect. Follow Prospect to its end and take a right onto Albany Avenue (Route 44) followed by a quick, sharp left onto Bloomfield Avenue (Route 189 North). The campus is a half-mile ahead on right. Follow the above directions upon entering campus.

**From Interstate 91 South:** Take exit 35 and turn right at the end of the ramp onto Wolcott Avenue. Continue straight as Wolcott Avenue turns into Cottage Grove Road (Route 218). You will come to the intersection of Routes 218 and 189. Take a left onto Bloomfield Avenue (Route 189 South) and proceed to the University of Hartford entrance less than two miles on the left. Follow directions above.

**From Interstate 91 North:** Follow signs and connect with I-84 West in Hartford to exit 44. Take a right off the end of the ramp and then your first left onto Prospect. Follow Prospect to its end and take a right onto Albany Avenue (Route 44) followed by a quick, sharp left onto Bloomfield Avenue (Route 189 North). The campus is a half-mile ahead on right. Follow the above directions upon entering campus.

**UNIVERSITY OF MAINE**

**By Air:** Bangor International Airport or Portland International Jetport  
**Distance from Bangor Int'l. Airport to Alfond Arena:** 15 miles  
**Distance from Portland Jetport to Alfond Arena:** 130 miles

**From the South:** Take Interstate 95 to Exit 193 (Stillwater/Old Town). Bear right at end of off-ramp onto Stillwater Avenue. At fourth set of lights (McDonald's on left) take a right onto College Avenue. Travel one mile on College Avenue. Turn left onto UMaine campus just prior to Alfond Sports Arena (ice hockey and basketball). Alfond parking lot is directly in front.

**From Bangor Int'l. Airport:** Exit airport and take right onto Union Street. Travel through three set of lights and after crossing overpass take left onto Interstate 95 North. Follow directions above.

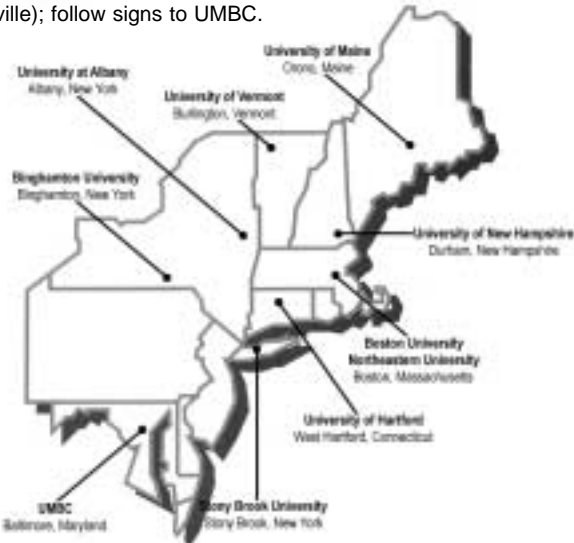
**UMBC**

**By Air:** Baltimore-Washington International Airport  
**Distance from BWI Airport to RAC:** five miles

**By Train:** Amtrak service is available to nearby BWI Train Station.

**From the North:** Take Interstate 95 to Route 166 (Exit 47B, Catonsville) or take Interstate 83 to the Baltimore Beltway (I-695, west) and then take Exit 12C (Wilkins Avenue, west); follow the signs to UMBC.

**From the South:** Take Interstate 95 to Route 166 (Exit 47B, Catonsville); follow signs to UMBC.



**UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

**By Air:** Boston's Logan International Airport, Portland (Maine) International Jetport, or Manchester Airport  
**Distance from Logan Airport to Lundholm Gym:** 65 miles  
**Distance from Portland Jetport to Lundholm Gym:** 60 miles  
**Distance from Manchester Airport to Lundholm Gym:** 40 miles

**From South (Interstate 95 N):** Take Interstate 95 North to New Hampshire. Exit 4 (Portsmouth Circle). Follow Spaulding Turnpike (Exit 4). Continue North to Exit 6W and follow Route 4 West past the UNH/Durham Route 108 exit. Exit at Route 155A and turn east toward Durham. Follow 155A past a short stretch of fields to the UNH Athletic Fields and Fieldhouse. Ample parking is available in "A Lot" directly across from the Fieldhouse (Lundholm Gymnasium) and adjacent to the Whittemore Center.

**From North (Interstate 95S):** Follow I-95 South to Exit 5. Continue on Spaulding Turnpike North to Exit 6W and follow Route 4 West. Follow directions as listed above.

**From Manchester, N.H.:** Take Route 101 to Epping; go north on Route 125 to the Lee Traffic Circle. Drive East on Route 4 to the Route 155A exit. Follow directions as listed above.

**NORTHEASTERN UNIVERSITY**

**By Air:** Boston's Logan International Airport  
**Distance from Logan Airport to Solomon Court:** 10 miles

**By Train:** Amtrak service is available to Boston's South Station.

**Public Transit:** Take MBTA Green Line's "E" train to Northeastern University.

**From the West (Massachusetts Turnpike East):** Follow turnpike into tunnel and take Prudential Exit. Proceed westbound on Huntington Avenue. Solomon Court is approximately three-tenths of a mile on left at intersection of Huntington and Forsyth Street.

**From the South and West (128/95):** Take 128/95 to Route 93. Take Mass. Ave. exit and take right onto Mass. Ave. Follow Mass. Ave. through seven set of lights until St. Botolph Street. Take left onto St. Botolph and follow to stop sign. Take right onto Gainsborough Street and then a left onto Huntington Avenue. Solomon Court is on the left at corner of Huntington Avenue and Forsyth Street.

**From the North (93/95 South across Tobin Bridge):** Take Exit #26 (Storrow Drive) and follow signs for Storrow Drive. Take Fenway exit and proceed straight off exit ramp (follow signs for Boylston Street Inbound, do not bear right) and continue through three sets of lights to Mass. Ave. Take right onto Mass. Ave. and proceed to Huntington Avenue (right after Symphony Hall). Take right onto Huntington and Solomon Court is on the left at the corners of Huntington and Forsyth Street.

**From Logan Airport:** Take Sumner Tunnel to I-93 South to Massachusetts Turnpike West. Follow turnpike into tunnel and take Prudential Exit. Proceed westbound on Huntington Avenue. Solomon Court is approximately three-tenths of a mile on left at intersection of Huntington and Forsyth Street.

**STONY BROOK UNIVERSITY**

**By Air:** Long Island MacArthur Field (Islip); JFK/LaGuardia  
**Distance from MacArthur Field to SB Complex:** 15 miles  
**Distance from JFK/LaGuardia to SB Complex:** 45-50 miles

**From West:** Long Island Expressway (I-495) Eastbound from the Queens Midtown Tunnel in Manhattan or the Throgs Neck Bridge or Whitestone Bridge to Exit 62 and follow Nicolls Road (Route 97) north for 8 1/2 miles. The main entrance to the University is on the left.

**Public Transportation:** Long Island Railroad's (LIRR) Port Jefferson Line stops on campus at Stony Brook.

**UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT**

**By Air:** Burlington International Airport  
**Distance from Burlington Airport to Patrick Gym:** five miles

**From South:** Take Interstate 93 North to Interstate 89. Follow I-89 to Burlington. Take exit 14W (Route 2-Burlington). Go left onto Spear Street. Patrick Gymnasium is on the right.

**From I-89:** Take Exit 14W into Burlington. Stay in far-right lane. Just past Sheraton and stop light, bear right at East Avenue/Spear Street exit, in lane for Spear Street. Take immediate left around jug handle, go through traffic light, which will take you onto Spear Street. Drive approximately 1/4 mile to Patrick Gym entrance on your right.

**Heading north from Route 7:** Follow Route 7 North from Shelburne. Just past Denny's Restaurant and just before reaching Burlington, take 189 East. Travel approximately one mile to I-89 North. Continue using directions as above, from I-89 (Exit 14W is the second exit upon entering I-89 North).
